- share experiences & lessons learnt in running a living lab on mobility (methodological & operational).

Principal responsibilities

The principal responsibilities of AOTF/WG will be to:

- Stream 1: Common understanding and knowledge exchange
 - Common living lab definition and vocabulary: Achieve a common understanding of mobility Living Labs by stimulating scientific debate on the use of LLs to address mobility challenges and co-create innovative mobility solutions contributing to the smart and green urban transformations. In particular, discuss possible categorisation and harmonisation possibilities as well the characteristics to be taken into account for it. [Continuous updates will be done based on the work done in the other activities].
 - Exchange of knowledge and experiences: Living lab science discussion about best practices and methodologies, projects and services, citizens science and co-creation methods. Focus will be put in "reflexibility" and expectations created/met. [This task will be alive in order to allow to update on new findings and insights/experiences coming from the execution of the other activities].
- Stream 2: Putting the basis for establishing collaborations
 - Collaboration framework definition and experimentation: Analyse synergies and complementarities across different mobility Living Labs and identify transferability, scalability and replication opportunities. For instance, plan a joint living lab project to evaluate cultural differences in new mobility solutions acceptance involving different living labs and contexts. [The framework will be

updated during the whole duration of the joint projects execution with lessons learnt].

- Formalization of collaborations and networking: Know other Living Labs better and develop relationships with them. For example, through the organization of visits and the joint participation to workshops. [This activity will roll out until the end of the project to give the opportunity for softer collaborations between participants].
- Joint projects: Execution of joint activities within the framework of projects (public funded, private or internal). Identification of the added value of such synergies, both from a scientific point of view but also from a more business dimension. [This activity will be managed by the participating parties who will report to the working group tactically while keeping the daily communication only between the involved entities].
